MSHS Careers in Construction

In the spring of 2019, the district and high school leadership team met to work with the Colorado Springs Housing & Building Association in bringing the Careers in Construction Colorado program to Manitou Springs High School. CCIC provides professional learning for our teachers, curriculum, materials and industry support. It also allows for ongoing mentorship from the CICC staff for students to be "placed" in work-based learning internships. This partnership has allowed our students to earn industry certificates that are recognized nationally.

Although all of this is incredible to ensure students have a variety of ways to be ready for careers and college, the ability to have hands-on industry partnered experiences during the school day is critical. It allows for

access and equity to students who are interested in pursuing these rich learning opportunities.

To continue the deep learning in this area, we will do a home build in partnership with CICC, starting in mid-October. This home build will take place on school grounds, with industry partnerships, and all the materials will be donated. When it's completed CICC, in partnership with the HBA, will sell the home to continue the funding of this work.

One of the most exciting elements of this project is that three Manitou Springs High School alumni will be supporting this work
